Dr. Gestson and PUHSD Governing Board,

It is virtually unheard of for a highly qualified and highly performing administrator to be non-renewed. When that administrator is also put on administrative leave, it is generally because they have committed a crime or are under investigation of a crime. We experienced this when the sisters were released in 2016 and it left deep scars in many of the long term employees in the finance department.

I am a highly qualified administrator

with a BS in Management and a Masters in Accounting and Finance and am also highly performing. In the three (3) years I have been with PUHSD I have had five (5) bosses, contributed significantly to two (2) and independently completed one (1) of the five (5) district wide software implementations, brought the ability for families and community to use credit cards for donations and fees, have worked with parents to establish Booster Clubs, have dedicated myself to teaching and supporting teachers/sponsors, and much more. I even converted the one system I implemented to work with Visions from my husband's bedside in ICU last June. I was not surprised however, when I was told I was to be non-renewed because none of my qualifications, accomplishments, or the support I was providing for our students were factors in the decision. I made one major error that resulted in my non-renewal, I spoke up for myself and employees being abused on the fourth floor and I refused to write up or perform processes that are illegal or would result in audit findings for the district. Yep, I blew the whistle and this is the result.

I actually believed in the 5 Cs and

that the senior administration valued the employees when I went for help. I expected they would work with us to address issues. In the first several meetings with HR it seemed like things could get better. They even had my name removed from the submission to the Board that would result in an audit finding per my request since it had been modified from my submission to no longer be compliant. When I went for my last meeting in HR everything changed. All was dismissed as "this is just an employee who disagrees with their supervisor". At that moment I knew there would be no support for me, my staff, or any other employee. I would have to leave PUHSD because I could not sit and watch what was happening. I went to the Superintendent's office and said I was going to look for a position and would be leaving, but I wanted to meet with Dr. G to let him know why, when I do leave. Since all that is happening on the fourth floor is the complete opposite of what he keeps saying in meetings, I assumed he didn't know or he would have stopped it. I guess I was wrong. It is sad really because just a month earlier I had spoken with him in the elevator and said I wanted to meet with him in the near future. I was going to talk to him about an internship so I could move toward becoming a Superintendent someday. Amazing how things can change when all hope is lost.

What did shock me was being put on

administrative leave for the remainder of my contract. I was told I was being non-renewed because they are going in a different direction in staffing and no reason was given for the administrative leave. When I noted this was going to hinder my ability to get a position I was told it wouldn't since dates of employment is what is given and all my reviews are good. I have thought a lot about why they would put me on admin leave knowing they were going to have to spend a lot of resources to bring in the software company to train someone on the InTouch system. The only conclusion I can come to is that they are trying to create the impression that I have done something wrong. While this may put the other employees in line to comply with whatever they are told, it will also damage my reputation and will make all the individuals I have trained in the last three years question what they have learned. This is not acceptable.

I have already been told that the Board would reject any appeal and it is clear that Sherry and Mary have more power than I could ever contend with so this is the only avenue I have to address what has happened. The Board can pull it or leave it and will vote as they see fit. What I am requesting is that I receive something in writing from the Superintendent indicating that my position has been eliminated, they are going a different direction, and the leave is so they can move now. If that is not the case, than I am being non-renewed for reporting issues and the admin leave is intended to simply mislead people about what happened.

I do intend on being at the next Board

meeting should any of you have any questions. I do not want people to think I have done anything wrong and this is the only thing I can do to show I am not slinking out under cover of wrong doing. I have loved and been dedicated to PUHSD to the extent that I take it with me everywhere, even on vacation and to ASBA/NSBA conferences. I still care for those

that I have served and always will so I don't want this to be any harder on me or them than it is already going to be. Since I am on paid administrative leave, I will remain available for any questions that the district may have including anyone from InTouch that is brought in to train. When I converted the system I established processes to streamline posting in Visions that are not done in any other district so they may need to know what I did.

Please let me know if my request is

going to be honored. While I do not want to make any waves through this I also need to ensure that my future is not being damaged for doing the right thing.

I am sending this to all emails I can

find for Board members and to the District staff that I believe would be vested in this information. Thank you for taking the time to read this.

2.A Recognitions and Accomplishments

The Governing Board recognized the following students, staff, and individuals:

Burton Family Foundation:

Christine and Daryl Burton of the Burton Family Foundation were recognized for their generous contributions to Phoenix Union.

Participatory Budgeting Campaign:

Cyndi Tercero, the District's Student Support Services Manager, was recognized for coordinating the ten-election campaign throughout the District with Phoenix Union schools over a two-week period, February 26-March 9. A total of 10,158 students voted, which was a 71% voter turnout at ten Phoenix Union schools. The Phoenix Coding Academy had a 92% turnout, Central, 89% and Metro Tech, 88%.

DLA Conference:

This year, 13 students from seven Phoenix Union schools earned 16 scholarships, totaling \$16,500. One student who participated in the personal leadership training, will earn \$3,500 in scholarships, and was selected to give his speech at the DLA conference this fall, after delivering it to DLA members last month. **Niyonkuru-Alexis Pamphile** from Metro Tech gave a speech during the Board meeting.

3. REPORTS

3.A Student Government Report

Mr. Michael Colonica, Student Body Representative from the Phoenix Coding Academy, gave the student report. Student Government did not report any school or student concerns, and instead thanked the Governing Board and the District Leadership Team for placing such a high value on input from students and allowing the report to be part of the Board Agenda.

3.B Governing Board's Response to Student Government Concerns

Mr. Prescott responded to the Student Government Representative that at the March 1 Board meeting there were no school or student concerns brought to the Governing Board, but instead recognized the District staff and the Board.

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3.C Superintendent's Report

Dr. Gestson gave an update with regard to the Academies at South. The Launch ceremony will be held on Thursday, April 26, 2018 at South Mountain High School.

He reported that the Phoenix Union High School District held a Job Fair on March 3 at the Phoenix Coding Academy and was a great success. There will be a second Job Fair in the spring that will be held on May 5, in order to have all positions filled by the first day of school.

The Restorative Justice Summit was held at Metro Tech High School for Security Assistants, School Resource Officers, and Partner Districts.

Two PUHSD Robotics teams will be heading to Houston later in April for the FIRST World Championship. Carl Hayden, by virtue of winning not only the Arizona North Regional, but also the Las Vegas Regional in the last month. They will be joined by first-year team, the Phoenix Coding Academy Python Robotics, who are invited after winning the All-Star Rookie Award in a California Regional, for the best first-year program. Betty Fairfax, Bioscience, and North will also be competing in the regionals that weekend.

Dr. Gestson stated that the District is supportive of students traveling the world. During Spring break in March 2018, Metro Tech High School students and their teacher, Ms. Ellen Driscoll, visited Paris, France and Barcelona, Spain.

The Governing Board will be asked to approve the 2018-2019 Salary and Benefits Packages during that meeting and thanked all the employee Associations and Ms. Resha Gentry-Balance, Mr. Phillip Wooley, and Mr. Tom Oviatt for their hard work. The District's goal is to bring a new salary schedule during the spring of 2019.

The Phoenix Union High School District provides great support for DREAMers through scholarship opportunities. Dr. Gestson introduced Mr. Rodrigo Dorador who would inform the Board about the Immigrant Scholarship Hustle program.

Mr. Dorador thanked the Board and staff for standing up for immigrant students. He presented the following two requests to the Board: to provide professional development for teachers, counselors, SROs, District administrators, and other staff through workshops or conferences; and to financially support. Immigration Scholarship Hustle. He also provided the Board with the following recommendations: to consider creating a scholarship for undocumented youth; and to consider creating a position for a Youth Support Coordinator in the District. He thanked the Board for their consideration and support.

Mr. Prescott thanked Mr. Dorador and everyone in ALAS for his support.

He explained that the Sale of Bonds PowerPoint presentation showed the Logistics Division's spending categories for the following areas: Phoenix Union-Wilson College Preparatory; HVAC & Energy Management upgrades on 16 campuses; remodeling of student service entrances at Trevor Browne and Desiderata High Schools; bathroom renovations at Cesar Chavez High School; culinary arts remodel at North High School; Gifted & Talented at Maryvale High School; exterior painting of Maryvale, Central, and Camelback High Schools; new Fire alarm systems at Maryvale, Camelback, and CEE; new security systems at Alhambra, Trevor, Browne, Camelback, and Desiderata; new camera systems at South Mountain, Maryvale, and Cesar Chavez, Interior locking mechanisms for lock-down; 20 vans that replaced aging vans on campuses and additional 12 wheel chair accessible vans for campuses.

Dr. Gestson informed the Board of the updates from the Technology & Innovation Division spending in the following categories: Sprint Home Internet Connections for all eligible 9th and 10th grade; laptop carts of 36 for all Social Studies and Math teachers: rollout to begin April 2018; increased Bandwidth from 2GB to 10GB: January 2018; successful transition, implementation and support to the iVisions system; selection, purchase and rollout on our first data warehouse; instructional technology classroom Support: 2018-2019; 90% finished with E-Rate Infrastructure Projects such as 1,405 additional Internal and External Access points; new servers, cache servers, equipment, switches, batteries (UPS), filters, routers, and firewall.

Mr. Danley stated that Phoenix Union schools should be an internet hot spot for community members and students that do not have access to internet. He stated that there should be a way for community members to have internet connectivity.

Dr. Gestson informed the Board that he would have Ms. Thea Andrade, Executive Director, Technology & Innovation, and Ms. Amy Remfrey, Director of Information Technology to provide an update on what that would look like.
